

Videos demonstrating different ways students can develop financial literacy using the current curriculum have been posted on EduGAINS <www.edugains.ca>. Further materials to support other grades and courses (more lesson plans, subject-specific material) will be added to EduGAINS over the course of the school year.

This guide outlines selected clips that could be used to introduce a discussion about financial literacy with staff or parents. These clips could be used to provide background information, to raise awareness about financial literacy education and begin discussion about financial literacy with staff and the school community.
